Music

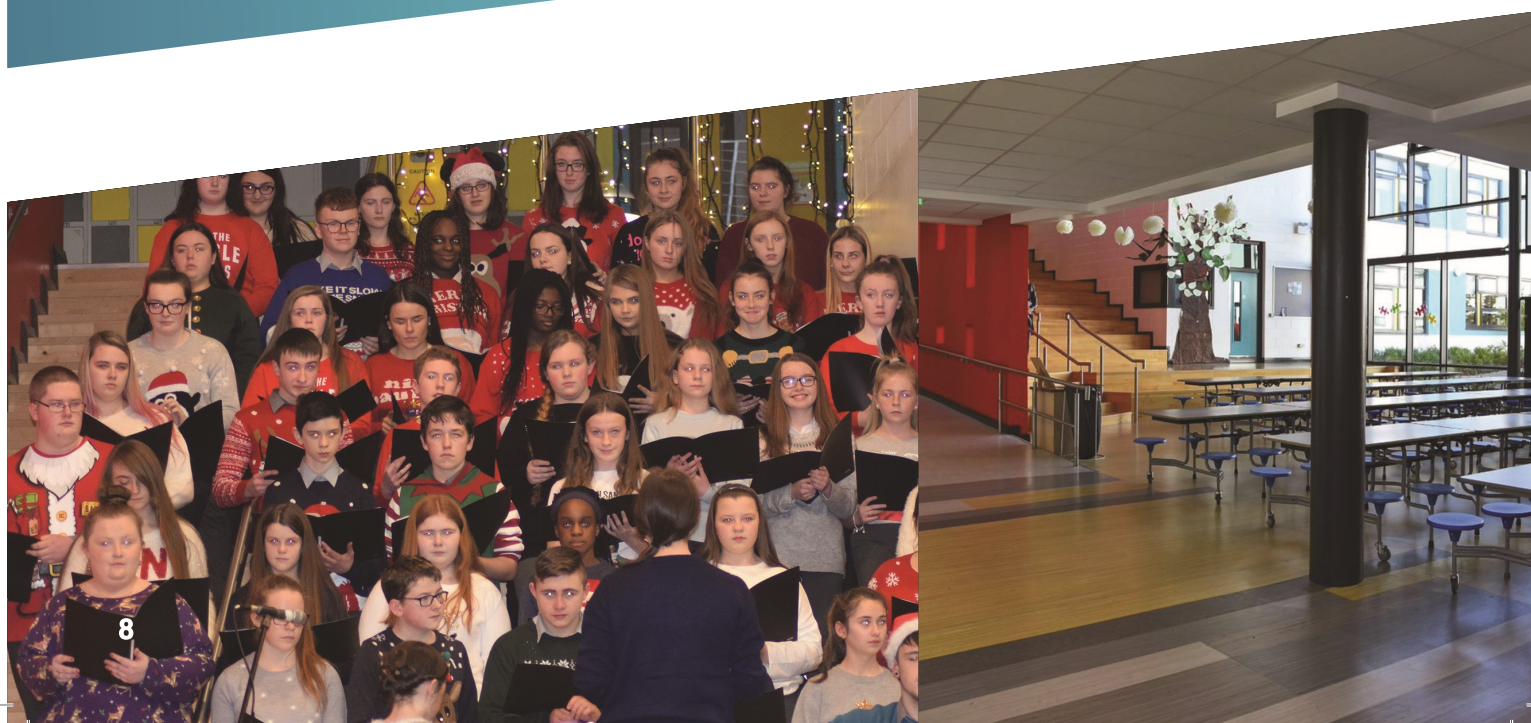
